As an advocate and professional, I have had the pleasure to collaborate with a wide variety of organizations, including the MRCA, Baldwin Hills Conservancy, State Parks, YMCA, LA Metro, OCTA, AAA, LA Walks, CalWalks, Bike LA (formerly LACBC), CORBA and numerous local and regional governmental agencies and offices. Additionally, I served on the Expo Phase II Advisory Committee (to ensure the successful integration of the Expo Bike Path along Metro's E-Line) providing me insightful knowledge into working through bureaucratic issues in the public sector.

In summary, I would be honored to represent the MRCA on the SCPA board. I believe my unique and varied background and experience will allow me to serve with integrity and dedication while representing a wide view of what open space means and serve the community and spaces I enjoy.
