**REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL FOR ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING DESIGN SERVICES
OF EMERGENCY STANDBY GENERATOR SYSTEMS
AT VARIOUS PARK LOCATIONS FOR
THE MOUNTAINS RECREATION AND CONSERVATION AUTHORITY**

The Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (MRCA) invites firms to submit a proposal package for review and possible interview for engineering and design services for emergency standby generator systems encompassing five (5) priority MRCA park facilities. MRCA seeks a firm to review the existing locations, evaluate building capacity and need during emergency conditions and outline necessary minor improvements to accommodate the recommended design. MRCA also requests supplemental information related to each design, such as permitting requirements and cost estimate for installation. A list of MRCA park locations to assess generator needs will be provided to the consulting firm.

SUBMISSION: Please provide your narrative, background information, and project team proposed fees, timeline, and other items as described in Attachment 2 as a PDF file. **Proposals are due by 5:00 pm on August 7, 2026**, and should be emailed to the address listed above. Late submissions will not be accepted.

SELECTION: Selection will be based on demonstrated competence and qualifications for the services to be performed at fair and reasonable prices to the MRCA. Proposed deviations from the RFP requirements will be noted and taken into consideration. Any proposal deemed irresponsible or unresponsive will not be considered. We aim to award the contract approximately one-two weeks after the bid due date.

SITE DESCRIPTION

Each site listed has MRCA staff residences and a radio repeater site or offices where a generator will be installed as a backup electrical source for emergency situations.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Consultant shall conduct all investigations, calculations, specifications, and related work necessary to prepare a recommended generator installation report for the above-mentioned parks. This includes assessing buildings and radio repeater sites and needs during outages; the model type and capacity of the recommended generator; the generator's recommended installation location (with GPS points included); and any additional electrical design for proper installation. Recommended generators must be energy-efficient, easy to maintain, and comply with all State and local ordinances. Generators cannot be portable; they must be connected and interfaced into a system. Consultant shall also determine if permits are needed for installation and provide assistance during the bid and construction phases (i.e., RFI assistance, review of substitutions, etc.) as needed; this work may be performed on an hourly basis. Development of as-builts for the installation of the generator(s) must also be included.

ABOUT THE MRCA

The Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (MRCA) is a local public agency exercising joint powers of [Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy](#), the [Conejo Recreation and Park District](#), and the [Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District](#) pursuant to Section 6500, *et seq.* of the Government Code.

The MRCA is dedicated to the preservation and management of local open space and parkland, watershed lands, trails, and wildlife habitat. The MRCA manages and provides ranger services for more than 75,000 acres of public lands and parks that it owns and that are owned by the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy or other agencies and provides comprehensive education and interpretation programs for the public. The MRCA works in cooperation with the Conservancy and other local government partners to acquire parkland, participate in vital planning processes, and complete major park improvement projects.

Section 2: Qualifications and Background

Submit the following for lead firm:

- Name, address, and brief history of firm.
- Resumes of those who would work on the project, including the Principal and the Project Manager at a minimum.
- Other relevant information that describes the firm's qualifications and background.

Section 3: Project Team

The Consulting firm should include an Electrical Engineer. If necessary, include a list of all proposed sub-consultants with their contact information. Sub-consultants require MRCA approval.

Section 4: Fee Proposal

Submit a fee proposal divided by the tasks above, subdivided by the 5 MRCA park locations. Fees should be supported by a detailed spreadsheet that shows the projected number of hours for each team member on each task. The fee proposal should be broken down by each priority location (see Attachment-6).

Section 4: Schedule/Timeline

Submit a basic project schedule. The schedule/timeline should start in mid-August 2026.

Firms may submit up to 5 pages of additional material.

EVALUATION

Proposals will be evaluated for the following criteria:

- Experience and technical competence
- Value offered considering the capabilities and experience
- Experience, qualifications, and availability of key personnel
- Capability to meet schedule constraints
- Suitability for the project

The information provided in response to the above requirements will be the basis for evaluation. Failure to provide this information or the inclusion of any conditions, limitations, or misrepresentations may adversely affect the evaluation of the proposal. The Executive Officer of the MRCA reserves the right not to award any contract.

All respondents will be required to represent and warrant that they, he, she, or the officers, directors, and/or employees of bidder are not related by blood or marriage to any member of the governing boards of the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy, the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy Advisory Committee, the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority, or any other joint powers authority for which the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy is a constituent member, or to any officer, director or staff member with discretion over the contract of any of the aforesaid public agencies. ATTACHMENT 3 – SCOPE OF WORK

A. SITE ANALYSIS

1. Consultant shall perform all investigations, calculations, specifications, and related work necessary to prepare a recommended generator installation report for the five (5) priority park locations listed in Attachment- 6. This includes assessing buildings and radio repeater sites and needs during outages; the model type and capacity of the recommended generator; the generator's recommended installation location (with GPS points included); and any additional electrical design for proper installation. Recommended generators must be energy efficient, easy to maintain, and comply with all State and local ordinances. Generators cannot be portable; they must be connected and interfaced into a system.

Deliverable: A recommended generator installation report for the five (5) priority park locations. The report should include: the recommended model type and capacity of the recommended generator; the generator's recommended installation location (with GPS points included); and any additional electrical design recommendations for proper installation.

B. Construction Documents

Consultant shall perform all necessary services required to prepare all necessary Construction Plans, Detail drawings and Specifications for the installation of recommended generators. Any major deviations from the approved Design Development Plans will require written authorization by the MRCA. Construction Documents shall include at least the following:

1. Complete preparation of all Construction Documents, Computations and Specifications, including all necessary drawings in sufficient detail to provide adequate information for accurate bids. Consultant is responsible for coordinating the drawing set.
2. Complete preparation of Specifications for required elements.
3. Consultant shall notify MRCA when work is approximately 50% complete, and again at 90% complete. At both 50% and 90%, the work will be reviewed by MRCA staff for compliance with previously approved plans, clarity, and adequacy as both a technical drawing and for use as a public document.
4. A Class A Construction Cost Estimate based on the revised drawings. It is the responsibility of the Consultant to notify the MRCA in writing prior to proceeding with Construction Documents if in the Consultants opinion, the modifications requested by the MRCA will materially affect the construction cost estimate or schedule. Consultant will obtain detailed construction costs based on the 50% CDs and updated at 90%. Consultant shall review this estimate and provide recommendations for Value Engineering.

5. Consultant shall submit plans to all applicable agencies for all necessary permits, which may include the Los Angeles City Department of Building and Safety (LADBS).

6. Correction of the Working Drawings and Specifications as required by MRCA following the 50% and/or 90% review; revisions to drawings required by LADBS or other plan checkers to bring the project “RTI” status; revisions necessary for Value Engineering.

7. The preparation of any supplemental information required to put the project out for public bid.

Deliverables: 50% Construction plans, 90% Construction plans, and cost estimates for both 50% and 90% plans.

C. Permitting, Bidding and Final Plans

Consultant shall confirm if permitting is necessary for the installation of generators. If so, Consultant shall perform all necessary services to provide Final Plans and Specifications necessary for construction of the Project and complete the permitting and bidding processes. The Final Plans shall include all the following:

1. “Ready to Issue” construction drawings and specifications for all aspects of the project. MRCA will provide the “front-end” specifications. Drawing set shall have been checked by consultant, to coordinate between disciplines and obviate conflicting features of construction or installation.
2. Respond to bidder questions, attend one job walk-through with bidders, and assist MRCA with bid evaluation. Prepare supplemental drawings as necessary.

Deliverables: 100% Construction plans with approvals, final specifications, services during bid process.

D. Construction Administration

During the period of construction of the project, the Consultant shall:

1. Issue clarified information, dimensions, details, and drawings and necessary to the Contractor, and respond to Requests For Information (RFI) prepared by the Contractor.
2. Check and approve all shop drawings and submittals submitted by the General Contractor, indicating thereon all errors, omissions and deviations from the Final Plans and Specifications, and required corrections.
3. Witness and report on all customary special performance tests required.

4. Attend regular coordination meetings to ensure construction does not deviate from the Final Plans and Specifications. |
5. Provide a final walk-through and punch list of corrections. |

SCOPE OF WORK: Consultant shall . Scope of work is further described in Exhibit A-Consultant's proposal dated .

TERM OF AGREEMENT: The term of this Agreement shall run from , 2014 until , 2014 unless previously terminated or extended. Prior to the completion date, either party may terminate this Agreement for any cause by providing the other party with thirty (30) days notice in writing. "Cause" is defined as a substantial default in performance.

In the event of termination by the MRCA prior to the completion date, the Consultant agrees to take all reasonable measures to prevent further costs to the MRCA under this Agreement, and the MRCA shall be responsible for any reasonable and noncancellable obligation incurred by the Consultant in the performance of this Agreement until the date of the notice to terminate, but only up to the unpaid balance of funding authorized under this Agreement.

In the event that the Consultant terminates this Agreement during the term of agreement as defined above, or fails to complete the project as described in the "Scope of Work", Consultant shall be liable for repayment to the MRCA of any amount paid by the MRCA under this Agreement for which work has not been performed. The MRCA may at its sole discretion consider extenuating circumstances and not require payment for work partially completed.

COMPENSATION: Total compensation shall not exceed \$, including \$ for fee and \$ for reimbursable expenses including but not limited to supplies, travel and printing. Consultant shall not incur additional expenses without the written prior approval of the Contracts Officer. Invoices shall clearly indicate services under this contract.

PAYMENT: Fees shall be paid to Consultant upon submission of invoices documenting completion of milestones and receipt of deliverables, no more often than monthly. Invoices for reimbursables must contain detail of expenses and be supported by receipts. Invoices for staff time must be substantiated by an hourly breakdown. Reimbursables will be paid at Consultant's cost and shall be listed separately from fee.

CONDITIONS:

1. Consultant shall indemnify and hold harmless the MRCA, its officers, agents and employees and if applicable the granting agency, against all claims of damages to the extent caused by the negligence, recklessness, or willful misconduct of the Consultant or its subcontractors or agents. Consultant shall obtain a policy of comprehensive liability insurance and worker's compensation insurance as required by law. Consultant shall maintain such policies in full force and affect at all times until acceptance of work by MRCA.
2. Consultant, and the agents and employees of the Consultant, in the performance of this Agreement, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the MRCA.
3. The MRCA Executive Officer shall appoint a Project Manager. Consultant shall contact the Project Manager if there are any questions or problems concerning this contract.
4. Without written consent of the MRCA, this Agreement is not assignable by Consultant either in whole or part. In the event of Consultant's death if a sole proprietor, or the dissolution of a partnership or corporation, or the transfer by sale or other means of Consultant's firm, it shall be

the MRCA's sole right to specify to which principal or company this contract shall be assigned.

5. Consultant acknowledges that time is of the essence in this agreement.

6. No alteration or variation of the terms of this contract shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto, and no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein, shall be binding on any of the parties hereto.

7. Consultant, by signing the contract does swear under penalty of perjury that no more than one final unappealable finding of contempt of court by a Federal court had been issued against the Consultant within the immediately preceding two year period because of the Consultant's failure to comply with an order of a Federal court which orders the Consultant to comply with an order of the National Labor Relations Board (Public Contract Code 10296).

8. Consultant agrees to provide the MRCA with an executed Form 19 Nondiscrimination Compliance Statement, Exhibit B.

9. If Consultant intends to hire or retain any other person, firm or corporation (sub-consultant) to perform the scope of work or other professional services under this Agreement, the selection of such sub-consultant shall be subject to MRCA's approval, provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to create any contractual relationship between MRCA and any professional so employed by Consultant. If it is determined that Consultant will contract directly with such sub-consultants, the following provisions shall apply: (i) any such sub-consultant shall be employed at Consultant's own cost and expense and shall be duly licensed in its field of specialization by the appropriate governmental authorities; (ii) Consultant shall be fully responsible to MRCA for the services rendered by such other parties; (iii) Consultant shall secure the written agreement of any such party that such party shall assume and agree to be bound by the same obligations as Consultant has assumed under the provisions of this Agreement; and (iv) Consultant shall provide MRCA with a copy of each such written agreement.

10. This agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. Facsimile signatures shall have the same force and effect as original signatures.

11. Consultant agrees to comply with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, regulations or ordinances.

12. Consultant and all sub-consultants shall be licensed by the State of California in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

13. The services rendered in the performance of this Agreement by Consultant will conform to the best practices of the industry or profession. Consultant shall at all times provide sufficient personnel to perform its services.

14. Consultant shall perform all of the services described herein and such other services as are customarily furnished in connection therewith.

15. Consultant shall perform the services in a professional manner and in accordance with such goals, objectives, guidelines and standards for the Project as may, from time to time, have previously been transmitted to Consultant.

16. MRCA shall deliver to the Consultant for its use data and information relevant to the Consultant's scope of work and in MRCA's possession. Consultant is entitled to rely upon the accuracy and completeness of all information provided by MRCA and shall provide prompt notice to MRCA upon discovery of any error, omission, or inconsistency in the information.

17. Consultant shall promptly correct or clarify any errors, ambiguities or deficiencies found in any documents, reports, or studies prepared by Consultant and attributable to errors or omissions of Consultant and no compensation shall be paid to or claimed by Consultant for services required to correct such deficiencies.

18. MRCA reserves the right to do other work in connection with this or any project by contract or otherwise. MRCA may employ contractors and other professionals in connection with the Project and Consultant shall cooperate and coordinate its services with that of such contractors and professionals as required to facilitate reasonable, orderly, and timely completion of the Project.

19. Insurance. As a condition precedent to the effectiveness of this Agreement, Consultant shall provide MRCA with proof of all required insurance, outlined below. Each policy required herein shall contain a clause providing that written notice shall be given to the MRCA 30 days prior to any termination, cancellation, suspension, or reduction in coverage or limits. MRCA shall not be responsible for any premiums or assessments on policy. Consultant shall include all sub-consultants as insureds under the policies required herein, or, shall provide MRCA with certificates and endorsements from each subcontractor for equivalent policies meeting the requirements herein.

A. Commercial General Liability. Consultant shall, at all times during the Term of this Agreement, maintain a policy of comprehensive liability insurance covering all Work to be done pursuant to this Agreement and any applicable amendments. The policy shall cover at least one million dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit per occurrence and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) in aggregate for bodily injury and property damage. The policy shall not exclude or except from coverage any of the Work required to be performed under this Agreement.

The following shall be named as additional insured on the Commercial General Liability policy: Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority, Conejo Recreation and Park District, Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District, Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy, and their employees, agents, directors, and officers.

B. Workers Compensation. Consultant shall, at all times during the Term of this Agreement and completion of Work, maintain appropriate workers compensation insurance with statutory limits as required by California law. This requirement shall not apply to Consultants who are exempt by California law, however MRCA assumes no liability should Consultant's determination of exemption be invalidated.

C. Professional Liability and Errors & Omissions. Consultant shall, at all times during the Term of this Agreement and completion of Work, maintain an insurance policy for professional Errors and Omissions and Professional Liability Insurance. Policy shall be effective at the time of execution of this contract with the policy period extending throughout the completion of the work. Minimum limits of coverage of the policy shall be \$1,000,000.00 per claim and \$1,000,000.00 aggregate and it shall protect Consultant against all claims, suits, or other actions of any nature brought for or on account of any injury, damage, or loss, including death,

to the extent caused by negligent acts, errors or omissions of Consultant in connection with the work performed under this Agreement.

20. If Consultant's services involve work which will be constructed, performed, or carried out by MRCA or MRCA's contractors, MRCA shall be the judge of performance of such work, in MRCA's sole discretion.

21. The MRCA acknowledges the Consultant's Construction Documents, including electronic files, as instruments of professional service. Nevertheless, the final documents prepared under this Agreement, including electronic files, shall become the property of MRCA upon completion of the services and payment of fee due Consultant for services rendered. Instruments of professional service provided in electronic media form, once released by Consultant, may be subject to inaccuracies, anomalies and errors due to electronic translation, formatting or interpretation. Consultant is not responsible for errors and omissions because of these conditions, nor for those resulting from conversion, modification, misinterpretation, misuse or reuse by others after electronic media is released by Consultant.

22. In all instances where the project is featured in print or other media, Consultant shall provide acknowledgement of MRCA as the project proponent and notify the Project Manager in advance of interviews.

23. Unless otherwise specified, submittals to MRCA of completed phases shall include three (3) full size drawing sets (bound); one (1) half-size set of drawings (bound); one (1) printed copy of specifications and other materials; all electronic files of drawings, specifications, and estimates in the original file format; and PDF files of drawings for viewing. Drawings shall be submitted in both AutoCAD format and PDF. PDFs of final documents shall bear Consultant's seal and signature if applicable. Unless otherwise specified, the trimmed sheet size of all drawings shall be 22" X 34". Calculations and other materials shall be submitted on the Consultant's or sub-consultant's letterhead as applicable. The page size of all specifications and estimates shall be 8-1/2" X 11" and shall be submitted in the original file format. Consultant shall provide material samples of all interior and exterior material and colors of an adequate size to determine texture and color.

1. During the performance of this contract, the recipient, Consultant shall not deny the contract's benefits to any person on the basis of religion, color, ethnic group identification, sex, age, physical or mental disability, nor shall they discriminate unlawfully against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, age or sex.
